About the HIV Medication Chart

- The Chart displays all formulations of each medication currently on the market, including liquid formula when available.
- Medications on the Chart are listed in the following order:
 - Grouped by drug class (NRTIs/NNRTIs/EI/PIs)
 - Commercial brand name (in bold)
 - Formal clinical name (in parentheses), which may also be the name used in studies/trials before a drug received FDA approval and became available to the public
- CRI updates the Chart as needed, with the date of each version listed at the bottom.
- The Chart can be a valuable tool in education and adherence efforts.
